# Romping with God

On Sunday, May 19, the Church celebrates the festival of Pentecost—the promised coming of the Holy Spirit. We will wear red to worship to reflect the flames of the Advocate alighting on each believer.

James Somerville presents a unique illustration of the Holy Spirit in his article written for *The Christian Century* entitled, "Who Will Take Care of Us?"...

When my wife puts her hand on the doorknob, her coat over her arm, my children look up from what they are doing to ask, "Who will take care of us?" and she gives them the name of one of their regular babysitters. All of them are capable, and my children enjoy the attention, but if my wife gives them one name—"Brittani"—my children leap up from what they are doing and rejoice. Brittani reads to them, romps with them, acts out plays and makes chocolate chip cookies; she nurtures their young lives like a loving parent, and as long as she is with them they are not afraid.

I don't know that the Holy Spirit has ever been compared to a babysitter. But if you can imagine Jesus as a mother, then it may not be so hard to imagine the Spirit in this other role, as one who cares for the church in the interim between Jesus' departure and return, as one who comforts, teaches, reminds, and yes, sometimes even romps with the sons and daughters of God.

The regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council was held on March 10, 2024 at 6:30pm. Council President Bonnie Arner called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

The cost to move the tower bells at Incarnation Church to Advent will cost approximately \$30,000, but Incarnation will pay half of cost. Bonnie will take request for funding to Memorial Committee. We could also do sponsorships to raise funds. Larry said Spring Township will require a zoning permit and building permit (with foundation drawings), but permission is not needed for the bells themselves. We may need a zoning variance, which could take 2 months for approval, because the bells may be less than 50 feet away from the center line of the road. If it's determined a variance is needed, it should be sought 3 months before construction is scheduled.
